(6) **Scone Palace:** crowning place of Scottish kings including Macbeth and Robert the Bruce, featured in *Ab Tere Dil Mein*. (7) **Perth Airport:** Madhuri lifted by helicopter. (8) **Dunkeld Cathedral:** romantic cathedral by River Tay. (9) **Loch Tay:** serene loch, popular for watersports. (10) **Loch Insh & Loch Insh Watersports Centre:** Akshay and Madhuri go canoeing. (11) **Edzell: Glenesk Hotel & Inglis Memorial Hall:** setting for Madhuri's home where Saif receives a soaking. (12) **Glasgow: Glasgow Botanic Gardens:** formal gardens and woodland walks, featured in *Ab Tere Dil Mein*.

Aishwarya leans out of a window as the handsome Abbas comes a-wooing. A.R. Rahman's title song is a lyrical Indian love ballad played out in a Scottish fairytale setting. A perennial Bollywood favourite (*Kuch Khatti Kuch Meethi, Kuch Kuch Hota Hai*), the castle has also starred in Hollywood movies including *Highlander* (1986) and *The World Is Not Enough* (1999).

Day 1

Begin your Bollywood adventure in **(1) Edinburgh**, Scotland's elegant capital and setting for a host of films including *Aarzo*, *Kuch Khatti Kuch Meethi* and *Main Solah Baras Ki*. Hop aboard an **open-top bus tour** and visit iconic **Edinburgh Castle (a)**, scenically perched atop an extinct volcano. Stroll down the historic **Royal Mile** and drop in to **The Scotch Whisky Experience (b)** for a fascinating journey through the whisky-making process before exploring the bohemian charm of the **Grassmarket (Mausam)**. For commanding views of the city, climb the spiral stairs of the **Scott Monument** in **Princes Street Gardens** or admire Edinburgh's spectacular skyline from **Calton Hill**, just like Salman Khan and Amisha Patel in *Yeh Hai Jalwa*. Day 2

Day 3

The following day head to **(12) Glasgow**, host city for the 2014 Commonwealth Games (and setting for the thrilling chase sequences in *Tezz* and *Kick*), to soak up the city's friendly atmosphere on an **open-top bus tour** like Sunil Shetty and Kajol in *Kuch Khatti Kuch Meethi*. Explore impressive **George Square**, where Salman Khan and Sanjay Dutt perform in *Yeh Hai Jalwa*, and visit one of the city's fascinating museums and galleries. The cutting-edge **Riverside Museum (d)** with its fine transport collection is a must-do, and you can even step onboard **The Tall Ship** berthed just outside - one of the few Clyde-built ships still afloat today. And if you're a beer fan, take a tour of the **Tennent's Wellpark Brewery** to discover how one of Scotland's best-known lagers is created.

Overnight: Glasgow

Day 4

Start your day early and head out of the city to visit what's often described as Scotland's most beautiful whisky distillery: **Glengoyne Distillery**. Beautifully located overlooking a waterfall and glen, it's easily reached in just forty minutes from Glasgow by car. During your tour you'll see the distillers at work crafting the amber-gold 'water of life'. Before you jet off home, experience Glasgow's superb shopping. Head to the bustling 'Style Mile' around **Argyle, Buchanan and Sauchiehall streets** for a dazzling variety of big-name brands, independent retailers, charming boutiques and speciality shops while **Princes Square (e) (Kyo Kii... Main Jhuth Nahin Bolta, Yeh Hai Jalwa)** will wow you with its chic and elegant designer stores: true retail therapy paradise.



Bollytrail 2: Lochs, Glens & Castles

Day 1

Begin your Bollywood adventure from the comfort of an open-top bus tour in **(1) Edinburgh** and make imposing **Edinburgh Castle** your first stop. Then stroll down the historic **Royal Mile** to **The Scotch Whisky Experience** to sample a 'wee dram' before heading for the bohemian **Grassmarket (a)**, setting for *Mausam*. The neo-Gothic **Scott Monument** in **Princes Street Gardens (Aarzoo, Kuch Khatti Kuch Meethi)** and **Calton Hill (Main Solah Baras Ki, Mausam, Yeh Hai Jalwa)** both offer spectacular views of Edinburgh's skyline.

Overnight: Edinburgh



Day 2

Head north to scenic Perthshire, gateway to the Highlands, pausing at the iconic **(3) Forth Road Bridge (Aarzoo, Main Solah Baras Ki, Yeh Dil Aashiqanaa)** – one of Scotland's most-recognised landmarks. Kids of all ages will enjoy a wildlife trip with a driver-guide at Aberfeldy's **Highland Safaris**. Then visit the picturesque **Edradour Distillery (mid-April to mid-October) (b)** near **Pitlochry** to discover the fine art of whisky production.

Overnight: Pitlochry

Day 3

From Pitlochry make your way to **Blair Atholl** to pick up some fine gifts (and why not a treat for yourself?) at **The House of Bruar**. The impressive food hall showcases an array of delicious local produce and the cashmere hall is the biggest in Britain. As you drive north to **(46) Inverness**, soak up the breathtaking Highland landscapes around you.

Overnight: Inverness

Day 4

Explore Inverness (*Main Solah Baras Ki, Three: Love Lies Betrayal*), thriving capital of the Highlands. Cruise world-famous **(44) Loch Ness**, look for the elusive Loch Ness Monster and explore the dramatic ruins of **(43) Urquhart Castle (c)**. Head west towards the **Isle of Skye** and try to catch sight of romantic **(20) Eilean Donan Castle (Kandukondain Kandukondain, Kuch Khatti Kuch Meethi, Kuch Kuch Hota Hai)** before the sun sets.

Overnight: Kyle of Lochalsh

Day 5

After exploring Eilean Donan Castle and scenic **Kyle of Lochalsh**, cross the **(26) Skye Bridge** and head to **Portree (d)**, Skye's cultural hub. No visit to Skye is complete without a stop at magnificent **Dunvegan Castle**, dramatically set on a rocky outcrop, and the stunning **(29) Trotternish** peninsula (*Kuch Khatti Kuch Meethi, Kyun! Ho Gaya Na...*).

Overnight: Portree

Day 6

On the final morning, take a ferry from **Armadale to Mallaig** and drive to beautiful **Glenfinnan**. In summer you might glimpse a vintage steam train crossing the **Glenfinnan Viaduct (e)**, featured in the Harry Potter films. Then explore magical **(33, 38, 59, 70) Glen Coe (Kuch Kuch Hota Hai, Main Solah Baras Ki, Soch, Kyun! Ho Gaya Na...)**. Its outstanding scenery (also seen in *Skyfall* (2012)) is certainly one of the highlights of any trip to Scotland.

Overnight: Glen Coe before driving to Glasgow in the morning
